This Policy shall be reviewed every 3 years.

**Responsible Body:**

**Authority:**

AMS Bylaw 5, Section 1(f)

**Intent:**

This policy is designed to allow for the creation of reasonable standards required for community members to access AMS owned or operated property.

**Applicability:**

This policy is applicable for all patrons of AMS owned or operated property except as otherwise noted in this policy.

**Exclusions:**

None

**Definitions:**

None

**Policy:**

1. All members of the general public are permitted to use AMS services and food service outlets located on the Society's property, provided they respect and adhere to reasonable community standards of behaviour.

2. The Operations Committee shall be responsible for developing these standards of behaviour and the necessary disciplinary procedures, including:

- a. procedures for warning individuals who are violating reasonable standards of behavior;
- b. procedures for expelling individuals from the AMS property;
- c. procedures for creating appropriate documentation of incidents in which the standards of behaviour were violated; and

d. procedures for posting or distributing information concerning standards of behavior.

3. All policies governing reasonable standards of behaviour and disciplinary procedures must first be approved by Council before becoming effective.

**History:**

This Policy was first created in August of 2006 and later revised in February of 2012. It was modified in January 2017 to replace references to SAC with references to the Operations Committee. It has now been completely overhauled.
