As of the September 25<sup>th</sup> Council meeting, the committee put forward Katrin Iacono, a 3<sup>rd</sup> year law student, former student clinician at the Women's Rise centre and current executive editor of the UBC Law review, for appointment as the next AMS Ombudsperson. Council confirmed the appointment unanimously and the committee is looking forward to working with our new Ombudsperson in the immediate future.
