Personal

- Personal financial situation

- Adherence to social distancing guidelines

What are we missing?

Local

- Comfort taking transit
- Commute to and from campus
- Availability of housing around campus

University / Academic

- Mode of program delivery
- Mechanisms for accommodation
- On-campus housing
- Availability of on-site testing

- **The creation of a Vaccination Clinic on Campus**
- **A Centralized Feedback Mechanism to Support Students and Faculty Who Are Not Able to Return In Person or may not be comfortable**
- **Financial Relief for International Student Self Isolation Expenses**
- **Additional Supports for International Students Requiring Visa Processing**
- **Lecture Recording Supports in the Classroom Post-Pandemic**
